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WELCOME

The speed of change in the field of Addiction Medicine is accelerating. From healthcare reform to marijuana legalization and from drug trading on "the hidden web" to pharmacogenetics, in this year's CSAM State of the Art conference entitled: "Synapse to Society," we aim to provide tools to help you navigate this brave new world. Additionally, we continue updating you on the fast changing landscape of pain and addiction with the best speakers, including **Anna Lembke, MD**, **Andrea Rubinstein, MD**, and **Jodie Trafton, PhD**. From X to Rx: Confronting Real World Obstacles to Buprenorphine Prescribing

This workshop is designed for ALL advocates of buprenorphine treatment. It will review the challenges of managing patients on buprenorphine in different practice settings and experts in the field will discuss successfully navigating DEA visits, obtaining reimbursement, managing inductions, performing urine drug testing, and preventing diversion.
